3. **EGM - To agree to an amended Constitution, that meets the changing nature of Wymondham Archers**

In person voting was undertaken until 19.40. The paper votes were collected and counted to add to the electronically collected votes. The meeting started at 19.52.

In total 62 members (25.2% of adult membership) were present in the room or on-line. The meeting was recorded on Zoom. All present had voted - papers circulated 28 days in advance.

As the meeting started Damien Lewington stood up and stated that this is the first meeting he has attended where he was asked to vote in advance of attending.

The Chair asked for a round of introductions - the committee introduced themselves, and their roles in the committee.

The Chair thanked members for voting and for attending. Then explained the purpose of the meeting - to enhance the club governance. The committee has discussed the proposed changes to the constitution and particularly thanks Dr. Sandra Edwards and Dr. John Packman for their efforts in supporting the work.

Members received an email with the proposed changes >28 days prior, to vote by today. Over 1,600 decisions have been made across all the votes, from 103 adult members (41.87% of membership). Today the votes shared will be those of the members present (whose votes are eligible for counting). The purpose of the meeting is to ratify the votes.

Jake Francis asked why voting closed 10 minutes into the meeting, noting that the votes counted will be those present. David Tonnison explained that the 10 min in the meeting was to allow people who had not voted on line to vote. The votes of those present in person or on line will be counted. Votes from those not present will be noted but are not eligible under the constitution. Jake stated twice more that he was not aware voting could take place in the meeting. The Chair explained that the constitution required they count the votes of those present only.

Keith MacDuff stated that those not present who voted thought that their vote would count. The Chair stated that it would not change today's vote. Those present are eligible to have their vote counted. The wider response will be made available.

Chris Norburn asked whether people who voted and not present understood their vote would not count. Colin Starling agreed and asked about the turnout. David Tonnison stated >20% had voted, that the current approach (nor any other) is not currently in the constitution and noted these proposed changes are a step toward becoming a CIO, but further changes to the constitution are likely to be necessary.

The Chair concluded noting that the club was only 10 years old and still developing its formal processes.

Imogen stated that people who aren't present were not aware that their vote would not count and that this arrangement should be made clear.

Holly Casey asked what 'Constitution' means - the Chair answered to Holly's satisfaction.

Max Roantree stated he thought that not counting votes of those present was not fair and not constitutional, especially as the committee didn't know whether they knew their votes would not be counted. David Tonnison stated that he thought it was in the current arrangements.

The Chair stated that they could decide in the meeting to include the 92 votes not counted; or leave the results without including the votes of those not present.

Salina Baboo stated the body of feeling is to count the votes of those not present as well as those present. The Chair asked the room as to whether all votes, not just those present, should be counted - majority in the room voted yes, online - unanimously yes.

The meeting was paused to add in the votes of those not present.

Damien Lewington asked whether there had been a meeting before where the changes were not debated. The Chair noted that this was challenging to have everyone in the room together to discuss; given the size of the club. Damien Lewington stated he could have voted on line and stayed at home.

The Chair explained that the EGM was to ratify the vote. David Tonnison explained that there has been an effort to ask and answer questions in the 28 days before the meeting. Damien Lewington stated he thought the committee should have canvassed about the vote. David explained that the vote was an opportunity to have your opinion. Damien Lewington stated that the committee should have gone round to promote their proposals. The Chair stated that there had been an effort to provide the documentation.

Thomas Rands - online - stated that he thought the online voting was confusing and not in line with good electoral practice given there was a blanket option to say yes but not to stay no.

Jake asked about fees for junior members. David explained this change in titles brings the membership types club in line with Archery GB at their request; but the club will still offer a junior fee.

Milo asked why associate members can't vote. Dave Tonnison explained it is about whose club you are part of. This has been compared with other clubs all of whom were surprised that the club would even consider to allow associate members to vote. The arrangement only affects running of the club because primary allegiance is to another club, but does not affect access to facilities. Second club members do circa 20% of shooting and are circa 10% of members.

Damien Lewington stated he is offended to be called a non-core member because he shoots for Clickers as his primary club. He has volunteered for the club helping with the tournament. Noted that associated members outnumbered primary members at the tournament. Terry Reeve stated you can only shoot for one club. The Chair acknowledged the views of associated members and their contribution on the day to the tournament. He noted the large size of the club and the background work to get the equipment. Milo stated that everyone should be treated the same. The Chair stated the rugby club doesn't let associate members vote including the archers.

The Chair concluded the vote result was clear but further discussion could be had at the committee meeting.

Chris Norburn asked about the difference in fees for associate members in archery vs the rugby club. Damien Lewington noted that rugby club associate membership is for non players and they pay £5 to RFU meaning they pay a lower fee than players / full members. The only difference in the archery club is the cost of Archery GB fees, but they get full use of the facility. In his view that means they should get to vote.

Terry Tippler stated that it sounds as if an associate rugby club member, and in the dictionary definition, has less rights so we should discuss whether the archery associate members may be something else and the club need to decide what they want if they want associate members to have equal status. What makes them associate members if they want to be the same as full members?

Thomas Rands asked about 10% members and did 20% of shooting - are we stripping away rights of those who shoot more, do the club want to introduce target fees - he thinks he should be able to shoot as much as he wants. He asked if he was worth the same as a full member. The Chair noted his value to the club.

Max noted the committee is making decisions which is their job, and asked if the attendees can see the minutes for this meeting to see what was decided. The Chair stated GDPR concerns had led to taking down previous committee minutes from the website because the work to redact them is too much. Jake stated he wanted the minutes from January onto the website. The Chair agreed.

Damien Lewington asked what constitutes a trained field captain and was referred to the documents on the website and the beginners course content.

Colin Starling asked for clarification about lone shooting - Chair clarified that Archers can shoot on their own as long as they abide by the Archery GB guidelines. As soon as more than one person is on the Range, the Chair stated, there must be a Range Captain.

Nigel Chalk suggested the documents be circulated to members - committee to follow up

Nigel Chalk stated it did not apply when archers are informally present to shoot e.g. they don't need to keep a register. The Chair noted the booking of tickets creates a register.

Chris Norburn asked about the liability for the person acting as field captain. Chair stated members access Range at their own risk. Mark Brookes stated that the field captain acts on behalf of the club. And agreed to get confirmation from Archery GB.
